EARLY ACTION NOVEMBER 1

- » For the best chance of admission to your first-choice campus and starting term, submit a complete application by our Early Action deadline of **November 1**. A complete application includes the online application, SRAR, and optional test scores.
- » Applying Early Action means you will receive an admission decision by December 24.
- » If admitted, the decision is not binding. You will have until May 1 to pay your enrollment deposit and commit to Penn State.

MIDDLE 50 PERCENT OF ADMITTED STUDENTS

THINGS TO KEEP IN MIND WHEN APPLYING TO PENN STATE

- » Review the high school requirements for your intended major at admissions.psu.edu/apply/requirements/4year. Some programs have additional math requirements.
- » Penn State accepts applications through MyPennState and the Common App. You may complete an application starting August 1 of your senior year.
- » Submit your Self-Reported Academic Record (SRAR). The SRAR is required to complete your application. A high school transcript will not be reviewed in place of the SRAR. Review more information at admissions.psu.edu/apply/srar.
- » Research campus options. Most students are required to choose two campuses on their application. We will review your application for your first-choice campus, and if we are unable to offer admission to that campus, we then evaluate you for your alternate choice campus. Review campus options at admissions.psu.edu/campuses.
- » The fall semester at the University Park campus is the most competitive and selective for admission. To give yourself a second review for the University Park campus, consider adding the summer session option to your application. More information can be found at summersession.psu.edu.
- » Make sure your intended major can be completed at the campus where you plan to earn your degree. You can review each major and find the starting and ending campuses at admissions.psu.edu/majors.
- » A redesigned FAFSA is expected to launch in December 2023 for the 2024 – 25 award year. Stay tuned for availability and deadlines at studentaid.gov.

A Penn State education is an investment in your future.

APPLYING FOR FINANCIAL AID

Financial aid can be an important part of putting a Penn State degree within reach. Financial aid includes loans, grants, work-study, or scholarships.

- » Submit the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at studentaid.gov. To maximize aid eligibility, submit the FAFSA as early as possible after it opens for your award year. Penn State's Federal School Code is **003329**.
- » Pennsylvania residents must submit their FAFSA by May 1 to be eligible for the Pennsylvania State Grant.

SCHOLARSHIPS

- » All students who are admitted to Penn State and submit a FAFSA are considered for scholarships. Some academic colleges, campuses, and other administrative units require additional information or separate applications.
